Objectives: Funding of up to \$10,000 is available to not-for-profit organisations for one-off projects and services that support and enhance the wellbeing of Lane Cove residents and the community.

Offers: ClubGrants; Food Grants; Small Grants Funding Program

Funding amounts are generally in the range of \$500 to \$2,000 with \$2,000 being the maximum awarded per project per year. It is available to not-for-profit organisations and community groups for projects addressing areas of high priority social need that support North Sydney Community.

Purpose: To support the provision of community services, specifically to engage and connect communities; host arts and cultural activities; enhance community safety and accessibility; promote health and wellbeing; enhance affordable housing; and encourage lifelong learning and volunteering.

Offers: Small Grants Funding Program. Applications will open for 2024-2025 Financial Year in March-April.

Applications currently open for 2024 – 2025 Financial Year.

Funding up to \$10,000 per application is available to not-for-profit organisations and community groups for one-off projects and services that support the residents of Lane Cove.

Application Process

All applications are submitted online only via <u>Smarty Grants</u>. Questions include:

- Applicant name and contact information;
- Organisation/group purpose or mission;
- ABN/Charity registration and structure details plus annual revenue;
- Details of governing body;
- Statistics on beneficiaries who are Lane Cove residents and volunteers;
- Other assistance from Council and other entities;
- Insurance details;
- Project details;
- Budget and contributions (monetary and inkind);
- Capacity to complete the project.

Closing Summary

- Be clear on what you are offering.
- Be clear on what you need.
- Consider collaborating with others.
- Understand the funder and their mission.
- Read all available documentation and contact the funding administrator.
- Address the criteria in a way that will benefit the recipient (your contribution to their success).
- Demonstrate how your idea will succeed.
- Draft, read, re-write, re-read ask for help.

Remember: It is a 'numbers' game. If you are not successful, do not take it personally.

- Look for the lesson (debrief and review)
- And know that what is for you will not pass you by!
